COTTESLOE WORKS CONFIRMATION OF REGISTERED SITE LOCATION

Thank you for your email to the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage (DPLH) dated 19 March 2018 in regards to the proposed Cottesloe underwater observatory and associated works.

A review of the Register of Places and Objects as well as the Aboriginal Heritage Database concludes that a portion of the proposed works as outlined in the file, '1310_180319_Cottesloe Pier_GPS Location Plan, GA Plans & Elevations', intersect with the boundaries of Aboriginal site ID 435 (MOONDERUP).

Your works at the end of the Cottesloe groyne do not intersect with the boundary of the site. The proposed timber access path and associated cabling all occur within Aboriginal site ID 435 (MOONDERUP), however, they are to be built on top of an existing concrete path. As such your works do not constitute an impact for which further approvals would be required.

I note that at this stage the public restrooms, norfolk pine avenue and disabled access ramp do not form part of your development application. These elements fall within the boundary of Aboriginal site ID 435 (MOONDERUP), and may require approvals should they form part of your development application in future.

For future reference, DPLH recommends that proponents refer to the State's Aboriginal Heritage Due Diligence Guidelines (Guidelines). The Guidelines can be found on the DPLH website at the following link:
