Hi Shirley,

Apologies for the delayed response we have been tied up over the past couple of weeks in dealing with numerous bushfires across the region.

As previously discussed with Laurie it is unlikely Parks and Wildlife would have any significant input into the planning or environmental assessment processes for this proposal but we do have the following preliminary comments for consideration.

It should also be noted that most of these comments are already covered briefly in the Preliminary Environmental Assessment completed by 360 Environmental and some will also be picked up in the EPA assessment and approvals process.

General comments:

- Proposed area falls within the Cottesloe Fish Habitat Area which is managed by Department of Fisheries
- Local ocean processes should be clearly understood and modelled to ensure sound knowledge of what disruptions, especially to longshore sand movement, the building could create.
- Consideration of possible user conflict with regards to recreational fishers and swimmers. There may need to be restrictions to fishing activities from the facility to maintain user safety.

Points of particular importance to Parks and Wildlife:

- Pile driving works to install pylons into the seafloor should follow EPA guidelines for underwater noise. The Preliminary Environmental Assessment identifies cetaceans and pinnipeds as being of significant concern and documented to occur in the development area. The proposed management measures should be followed to minimise potential impacts.
- A product similar to the 'Eco Shark Barrier' should be used for the shark proof enclosure to minimise the risk of bycatch or entanglement of animals in the barrier.
- There should be contingency plans in place for potential pollution incidents including sewage, grey water and hydro carbons.
- There should be adequate facilities and education to reduce the potential for litter to enter the marine environment. Possibility for the facility to be plastic free?
